WHAT TO BRING TO YOUR VITA APPOINTMENT

- Original photo identification for you and your spouse (if married filing jointly), such as a:
 - Valid U.S driver's license
 - Employer ID
 - School ID
 - State ID (U.S.)
 - Military ID
 - National ID
 - Visa
 - Passport
- Social Security cards for you, your spouse and dependents
 - Note: If you need to request a replacement card or update your Social Security record, go to <https://www.ssa.gov/number-card> to find the best way to do this.
- An Individual Taxpayer Identification Number (ITIN) notice CP-01A. We will assign an identity protection personal identification number (IP PIN) for you, your spouse and your dependents, if you do not have a Social Security number (SSN)
- Proof of foreign status, if applying for an ITIN
- Birth dates for you, your spouse and dependents on the tax return
- Wage and earning statements (Form W-2, W-2G, 1099-R, 1099-MISC) from all employers
- Last 2025 paystub (if claiming overtime deduction)
- Social Security Benefit Statements (SSA-1099), if applicable
- Interest and dividend statements from banks (Forms 1099)
- A copy of last year's federal and state returns, if available
- Proof of bank account routing and account numbers for direct deposit, such as a blank check
- Total paid for daycare provider and the daycare provider's tax identifying number, such as their SSN or business EIN
- Health Insurance Exemption Certificate, if received
- Forms 1095-A, Health Insurance Marketplace Statement
- Copies of income transcripts from IRS and state, if applicable
- To file taxes electronically on a married-filing-joint tax return, both spouses must be present to sign the required forms
